PRESENTER BIOGRAPHIES

SUSAN PRESCOTT

Prof. Susan L. Prescott MD, PhD, is a pediatrician, immunologist and internationally acclaimed physician scientist, well known for her cutting-edge research into the early environmental determinants of health and disease. Globally, she is recognised for her work on the interconnections between human health and planetary health and promoting mutualistic value systems for both ecological and social justice. She is Founding President of inVIVO Planetary Health and Editor-in-Chief of Challenges journal which promotes interdisciplinary discourse.

Locally in Western Australia, she is Director of The ORIGINS project, an intervention birth cohort of 10,000 families aimed at improving all aspects of long-term physical and mental health. Previously, she was the founding President of the DOHaD Society (Developmental Origins of Health and Disease) of Australia and New Zealand, and a Director of the World Allergy Organization. In addition to over 300 scientific publications, Susan is also an artist and award-winning author of several books—The Allergy Epidemic, The Calling, Origins and gold medal winning book The Secret Life of Your Microbiome. Her inspiration to study medicine came from her grandmother, one of the few women to study medicine in the 1930s.

SUSAN KEINO

Dr. Susan Keino is a Lecturer at the School of Public Health, Moi University, Kenya. She is a member of the Kenya Nutritionist and Dieticians Institute (KNDI) and Africa Women in Science and Engineering (AWSE) and World Public Health Nutrition Association (WPHNA).

She has a PhD in Human Nutrition from Maastricht University, the Netherlands. She has over 14 years teaching experiences in teaching, research and outreach at Moi University School of Public Health. She is also a member of the Moi University and Moi Teaching and Referral Hospital Institutional Research Ethics Committee. She has published in refereed journals, participated in ongoing and completed research projects. She teaches both undergraduate and postgraduate students and supervises student projects and thesis. Her research interest includes maternal and nutrition, food and nutrition systems, food security, One Health and Planetary Health; double burden of malnutrition and community disaster risk assessment. She has participated in several One Health and planetary health activities.
