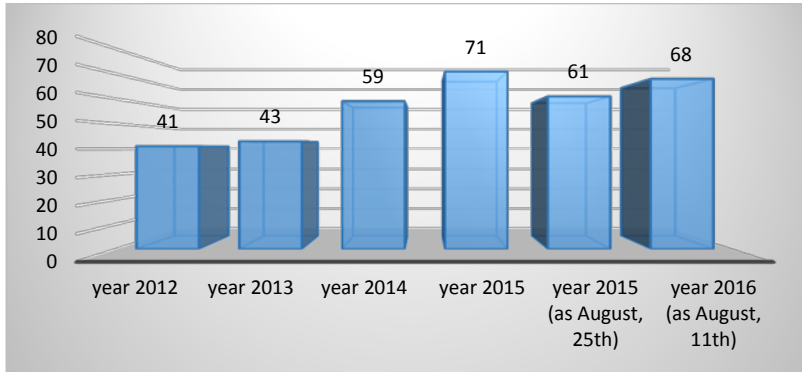

### **5. General Secretary's Report**

Nick Spencer reports on behalf of Geir Gunnlaugsson. Meetings have been regular with good participation of members under the leadership of the President. One Council meeting was held in February 2016. We have shown that by using appropriate technology we have managed to keep contact alive across continents.

**6. Treasurer’s Report**

Olivier Duperrex informed that, thanks to the new secure internet payment system with Wirecard administered by Kenes, an increasing number of members have paid their fees. The graph below shows the evolution and more details can be found in **Appendix 4**.



Informed that we still need more people to pay:

- a. known ISSOP members who, despite reminders, pay only their fee if they are coming to the Annual Meeting,
- b. new members to be recruited by everyone.

Urged members to keep their email addresses updated regularly in the discussion list and on the membership database, or at least to send a email to [issopmembership@kenes.com](mailto:issopmembership@kenes.com).

Presented the auditing of the finances: they are in line with Swiss law. We still do not pay tax. Stressed the following points:

- a. benefits from Geneva meeting were transferred to ISSOP account,
- b. important loss due to change in currency rate in 2015.

The AGM has a **formal vote** regarding the financial reports and to alleviate responsibility for the Executive Core. Accepted by acclamation by all present.

**7. IPAs Representative report**

Nick Spencer reported on Shanti Raman’s behalf. He emphasised the excellent work done to date and specially the work around bringing together IPA, IPSCAN and ISSOP into a partnership ‘End Violence against Children’. Details are available in **Appendix 2**.

**8. Trainee Group report.**

Nick Spencer reported on Rosie Kyeremateng’s behalf. The group has been very active, for example during in the UK by pushing the discussion into the RCPCH, contributing to several ISSOP working groups and with ISSOP facebook page and tweeter account (@socialpaeds). The membership of the group continues to expand. NS congratulates the group and encourages all members to be engaged in the trainee group, all are welcome.

**9. Sponsorship policy**

The current policy on sponsorship of ISSOP activities states in its title :

*ISSOP policy on sponsorship of its activities (excluding congress)*

ISSOP members were informed with the Agenda for the AGM, that the following proposal would be discussed: « ISSOP should remove the exclusion of congresses from the policy.»

Only two members transmitted their personal view on this.

After a discussion, raising several points (transparency, importance of members views and implications, ethical position of COI, difficulties that will happen when ISSOP will have a joint conference...), the decision with the vote of the majority of participants is:

- a. add the words « conflict of interest » somewhere in the text to make it clear and linked to the COI position statement
- b. take out "excluding Annual Meetings" from the title

Olivier Duperrex will prepare changes to be validated by the Executive committee.

**10. Venue for ISSOP 2017 and future meetings**

Two possibilities are currently discussed by Nick Spencer: Hungary (Zsuzsanna Kovaks) and USA (Jeff Goldhagen).

Erika Sievers will hold the 2018 meeting in Bonn.

It is stressed that video-conferencing should be part every next congresses.

ISSOP has had a further active year led by an active and committed core-EC which meets monthly. We still have too few members paying their annual subscriptions regularly which limits our ability to promote social paediatrics and child health.

#### ISSOP 2015: Geneva, Switzerland

ISSOP 2015 was held in Geneva and organised by Olivier Duperrex and colleagues. The conference was bilingual throughout with simultaneous translation in the plenary sessions. Geneva as a venue was particularly timely as the new WHO Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) had just been published in the city. The theme of the conference, 'Sustainable Development Goals (post-2015): A booster for Child health and Children's Rights' allowed us to discuss the new goals and the role of designed to provide the basis for further work on key aspects of child health and child rights. The conference workshops initiated new ISSOP work streams which are producing new and revised position statements (see below) and the involvement of ISSOP in international efforts to achieve the SDGs.

#### ISSOP & IPA:

Shanti Raman, our representative on the IPA Standing Committee, has been very active introducing social paediatric issues into IPA and working with IPA to present joint ISSOP/IPA/ISPCAN statements at the 2016 World Health Assembly. Shanti's report is appended below and will be discussed at the AGM.

#### ISSOP Trainee Group

The ISSOP Trainee Group continues to thrive. The group has 40 members connected by Google groups, and 67 members on the FaceBook page – you can connect on [Facebook > ISSOP international Society Of Social Pediatrics And Child Health](#). The ISSOP conference in Geneva was a wonderful opportunity to link with new faces and consolidate the group; and the internet platform has been a great enabler as a gateway to the variety of ISSOP activities. We now have members as far reaching as Mexico, Ethiopia, Japan and Turkey. The chair of the trainee group sits on the ISSOP Executive committee; this is currently Rosie Kyeremateng, and the group plan to transition to a new chair and secretary over the next year. Among the group activities, a popular media article breaking down the facts around inequalities and the determinants of child health was published; and member Darshana Bhattacharjee, has published online a regular round-up of child health and social issues, both from the UK and around the world - [Child health issues near and far- A weekly review \(W/B 14/12/15\)](#). Members of the trainee group are actively involved in all of the ISSOP working groups and the Conflict of Interest group.

#### Membership and administration:

We continue to work with Kenes on membership issues. We have improved the system of electronic payment for subscriptions and introduced the option of paying for 2 or 3 years subscription. Olivier will report on current membership figures. I would emphasise again the importance of more members paying their subscription – there are many more things we could be doing to promote social paediatrics with greater financial resources.

### **Position Statements:**

We currently have 6 completed Position Statements on the website. We are working on revisions of the statements on child health inequity and migrant children. A further two position statements are underway – a joint position statement with ISPCAN and IPA on prevention of violence against children and a position statement on a global agenda for social paediatrics linked to the SDGs. A major and important aspect of the work on these statements is the involvement of many colleagues who have not previously been active in ISSOP. The working group revising the child health inequity statement includes many members from low and middle income countries who joined in response to a request for participants made through Chifa.

Ayesha Kadir is leading the working groups on Violence against Children and migrant children jointly with other colleagues. As she is unable to attend the AGM in person, she has provided the following written reports:

#### Working group on Violence against Children

At the end of 2015, we started a working group on Violence against Children. Early on in our discussions we decided that we wanted to develop work that was geared to words action and meaningful change, and that this would require broader partnership with other organizations. Since then, we have been establishing collaborations with ISPCAN, the IPA, Know Violence in Childhood, UNICEF and WHO. Shanti is leading a small meeting during the upcoming IPA congress in Vancouver, on 20 August, during which the group will explore what work is currently underway, what evidence is available and what is forthcoming, and how we can use this to generate action to prevent violence against children at all levels and in all contexts. A policy statement has been outlined, and will serve as a spring point for future activity in a partnership to prevent violence against children.

#### Working group on Migration

The migration working group was launched after the workshop in migration and child health at the ISSOP annual meeting in Geneva, in September 2015. The group has focused its work during the past year on identifying the changing issues and needs for children on the move, gathering evidence, and using these to update the 2008 ISSOP position statement on migration. The final draft of the updated position statement is expected to be complete in time for the annual meeting in Santiago this September. The next steps of the group will focus on developing ways to share information and best practices, highlight the needs of special groups, and to bring our recommendations into practice both in clinical settings as well as in advocacy and policy.

### **ISSOP e-bulletin:**

We have now published 22 e-bulletins thanks particularly to the work of Tony Waterston and Raul Mercer who have now been joined by Gonca Yilmaz and Rita Nathawad to form a small Editorial Board. We are currently meeting our target of 6 issues of the bulletin/year. Raul will report further at the AGM.

### **CHIFA (formerly CHILD2015):**

ISSOP has continued to support this international e-forum financially and Tony Waterston is one of the forum moderators. CHIFA (Child Health Information for All) continues to grow. An administrator is now in post and 20 country respondents have been identified. A Spanish version supported by PAHO is in preparation. A webinar on immunisation is planned for later this year and suggestions for further topics for webinars are welcome. Tony will present a written report for circulation prior to the AGM.

### **ISSOP/ECPCP collaborative project on Child Rights:**

Luis Martin, Zsuzsanna Kovacs and Manuel Katz have been leading this important project in collaboration with ECPCP. Publication is imminent.

### **ISSOP/EAP/ECPCP:**

ISSOP is participating in a European Academy of Pediatrics (EAP) working group on health inequalities among migrant children. A survey of European primary care paediatricians is being undertaken as part of this project. Luis Martin is leading on this for ISSOP along with Erika Seivers and Ayesha Kadir. Luis will report further at the AGM.

### **Summer Courses:**

An ISSOP course was held in Zagreb, Croatia in June 2016 on the theme 'Child Friendly Cities'. Luis Martin represented ISSOP at the course and will report in the AGM. Future courses will also be discussed.

## Appendix 2

### Report on IPA Standing Committee 2016 Shanti Raman ISSOP Representative on IPA

As the ISSOP representative on the IPA Standing Committee (SC) — I have had a very active and challenging year. The various and sometimes competing tasks of leading the Quality of Care Technical Advisory Group (TAG-QC) for the IPA, representing social paediatrics and child health interests to the broader paediatric community and in particular pushing the agendas of ending violence against children, raising issues of conflict of interest between paediatricians and their relationship to industry, and inequities in child health— have been difficult at times.

#### **TAG-QC**

As Chair of TAG-QC, I wanted to build on the work of my predecessor Dr Tamburlini, but also bring in some important quality elements from the children's rights in health services and harness the impetus that is flowing from the Every Newborn Action Plan. The main activities have been:

1. Mapping activities undertaken by national and regional paediatric societies in the quality and safety and child rights arena. I developed a checklist and questionnaire and disseminated this using Survey Monkey to all IPA member societies—unfortunately the response rate was so low that it was not work analysing.
2. Promoting and monitoring Quality activities globally, with a particular focus on children's rights in health services, quality and safety initiatives in national and regional Paediatric societies, district level paediatric hospital care and Every Mother Every Newborn quality activities—this was achieved by sharing information via email and skype teleconferences within the TAG.
3. Planning for TAG-QC sessions at the 2016 International Pediatric Congress: these consist of a pre-congress workshop aimed at low/middle income countries and also a concurrent session within the Congress.
4. Forming partnerships with other relevant global agencies such as UNICEF, WHO and ISPCAN to push for training and research into the highest quality of care for children and young people, whilst promoting and upholding their rights.

#### **IPA SC**

As the ISSOP representative on the IPA Standing Committee, I have been trying to keep social paediatric issues prominently on the agenda with IPA with occasional success. The big success was getting IPA to agree to work collaboratively on ending Violence against Children with ISSOP and ISPCAN and getting ISSOP statements on child health inequities and violence against children tabled at the 2016 World Health Assembly.

#### **IPA Congress Vancouver 2016**

This Congress is a good opportunity to influence mainstream paediatricians about the importance of a public health approach to paediatrics and child health. We tried to get separate sessions or workshops for ISSOP to feature, but were reassured by the Congress organising Committee that social paediatrics and public health would be integrated into all sessions in the program. There are major plenary sessions on adolescent health, SDGs, global health, environmental health and child survival. An issue that we will need to keep vigilant about is to monitor the role of baby food manufacturers and their role in sponsorship of education sessions within the Congress.

#### **Global Partnership to end Violence against Children**

ISSOP, ISPCAN and IPA have formed a collaboration to get some practical action on preventing Violence against Children. The first step was to agree on the scope and definitions of violence in childhood, so we have committed to collaborating on a position statement. ISSOP has joined the global Partnership to End Violence in Children. Within the IPA Congress, I have managed to organise a separate breakout session to discuss the partnership, where we are at with the position statement on Violence against Children and how to move forward with advocacy efforts.

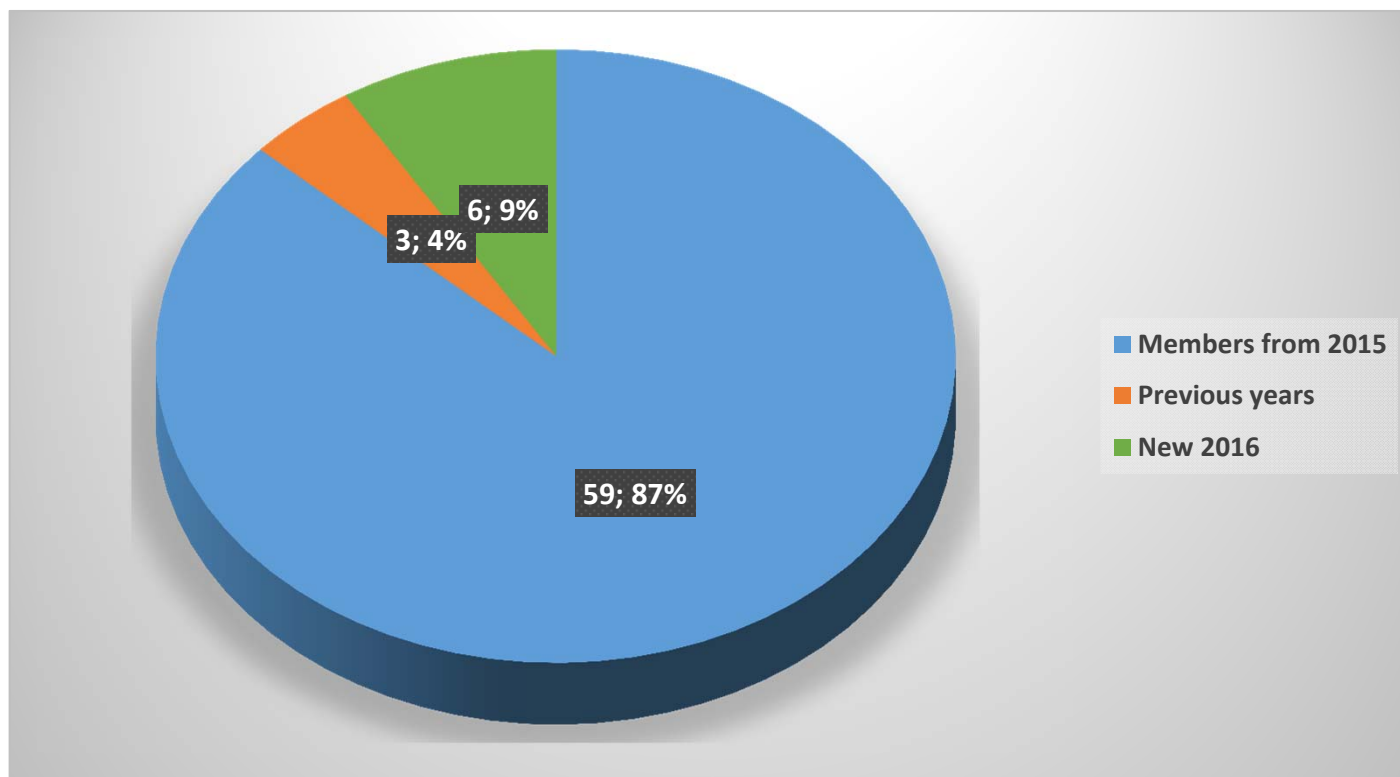

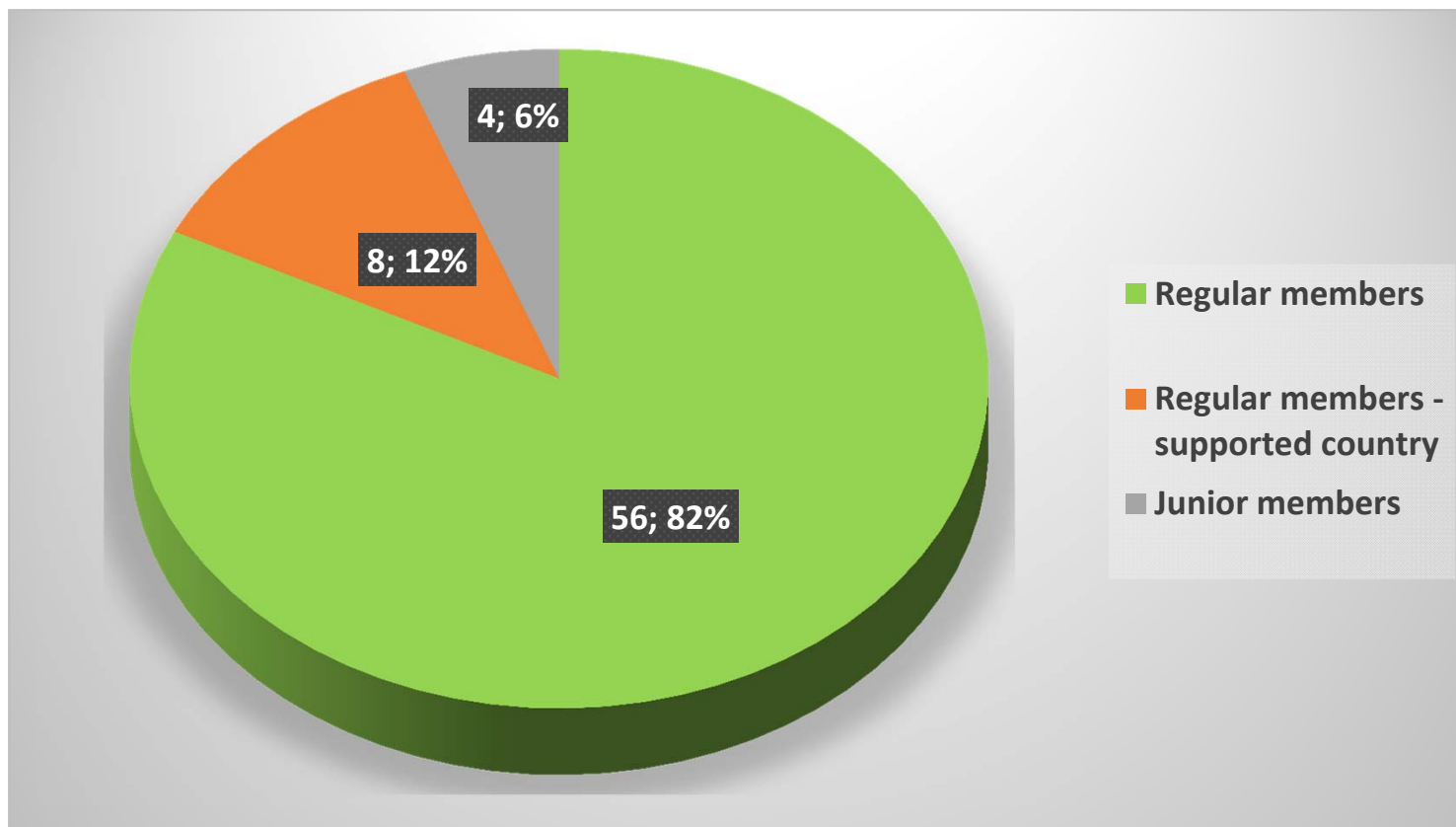

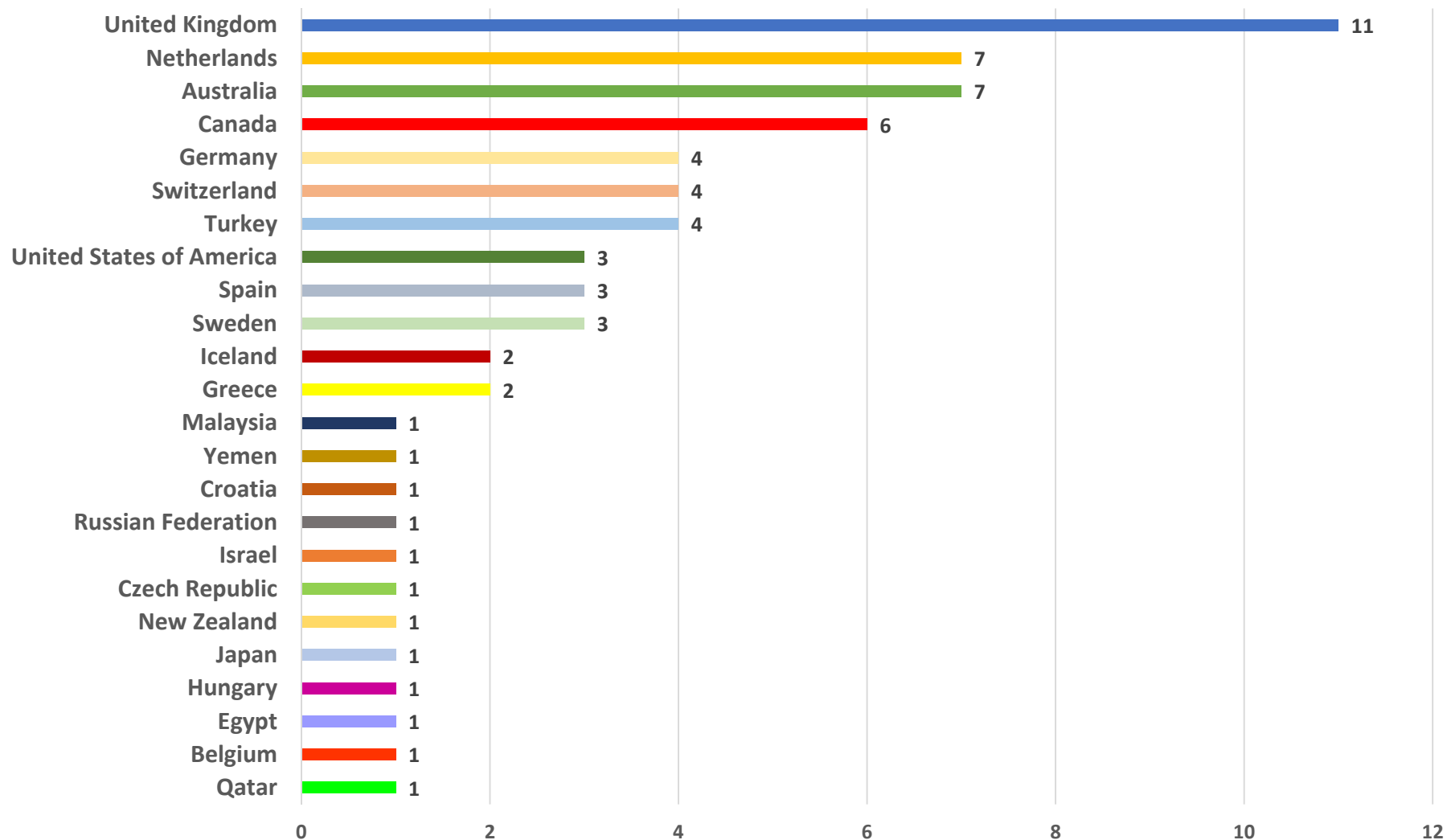

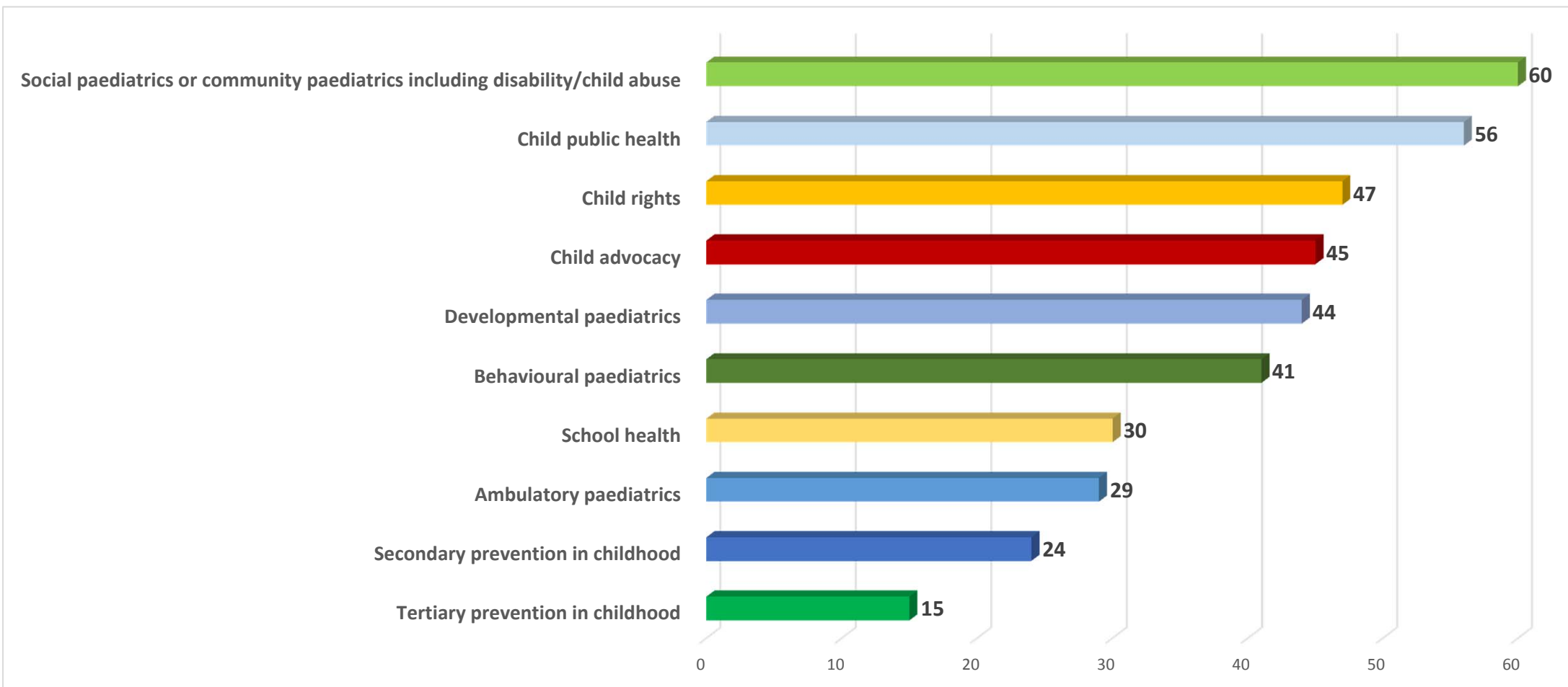
